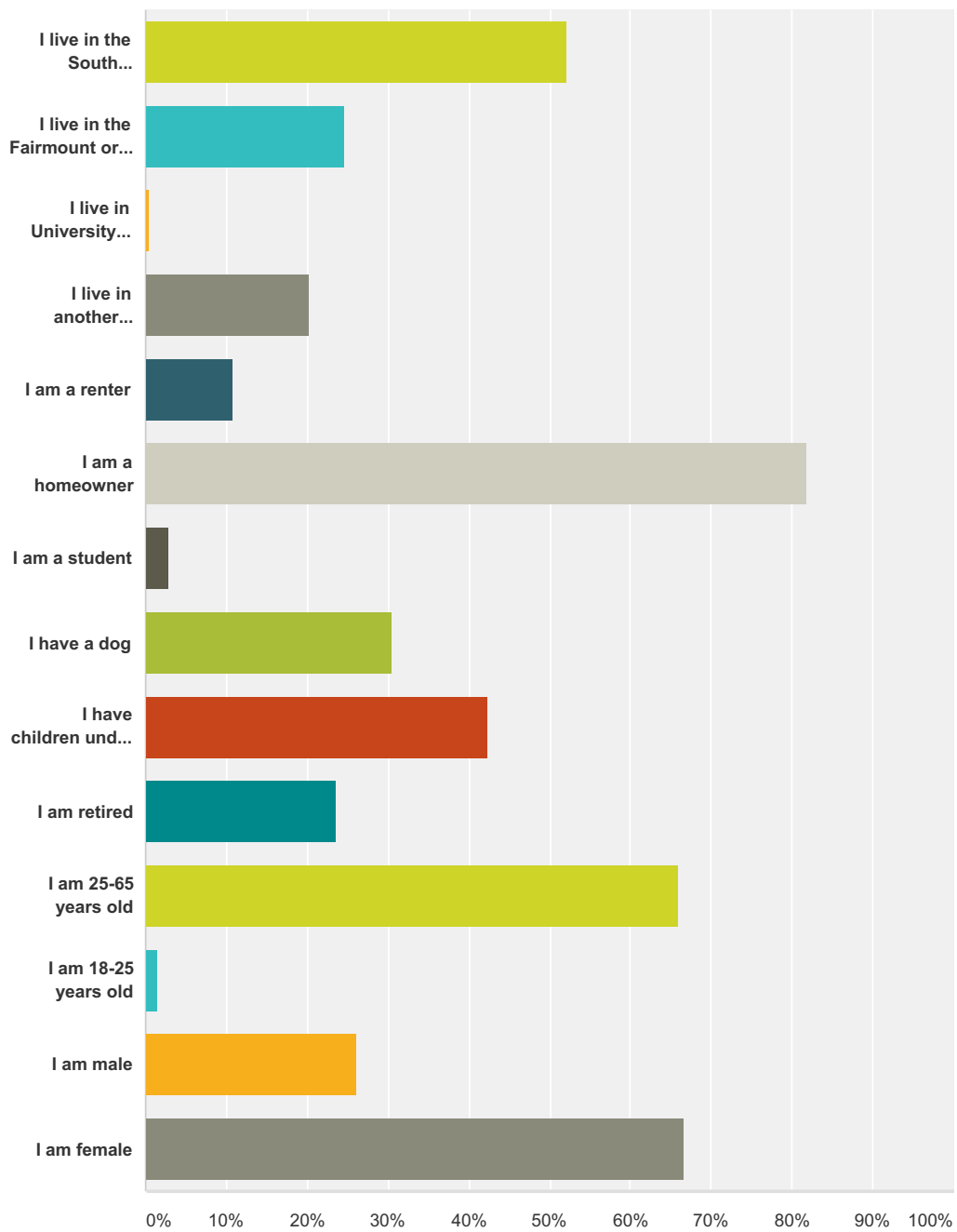

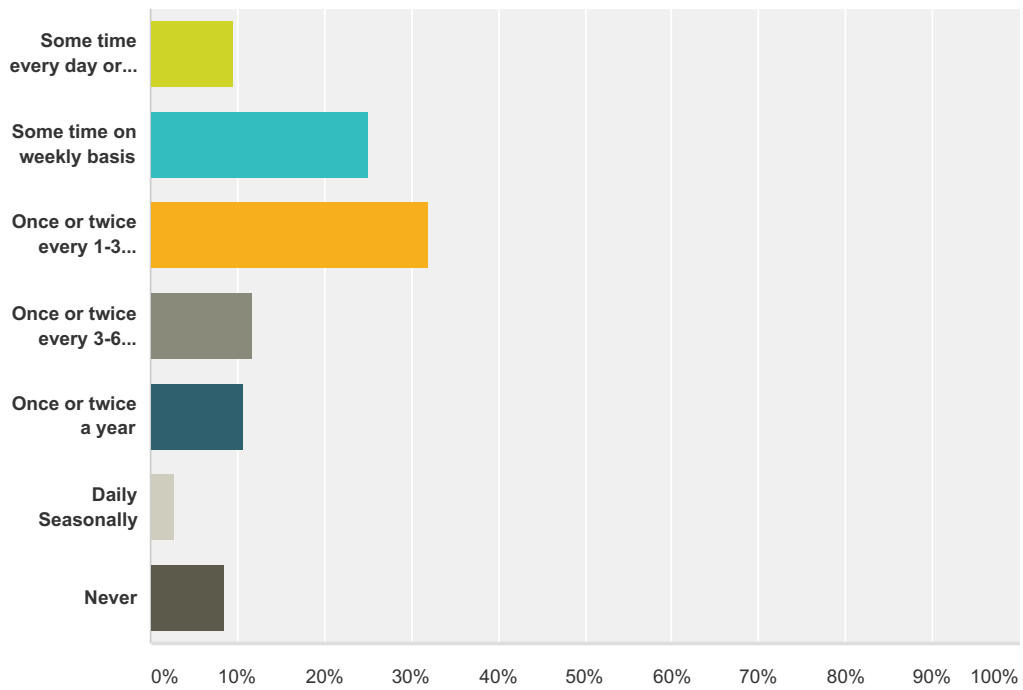

Q2 In the last 12 months, how much time did you spend time at University Park?

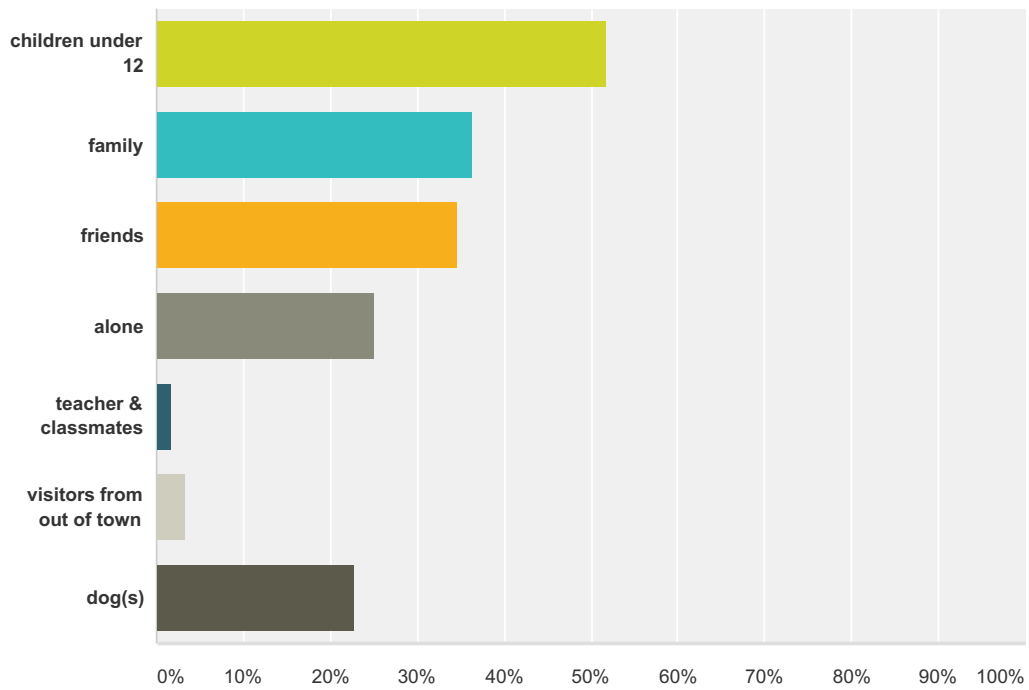

Q3 Who do you attend the park with most often?

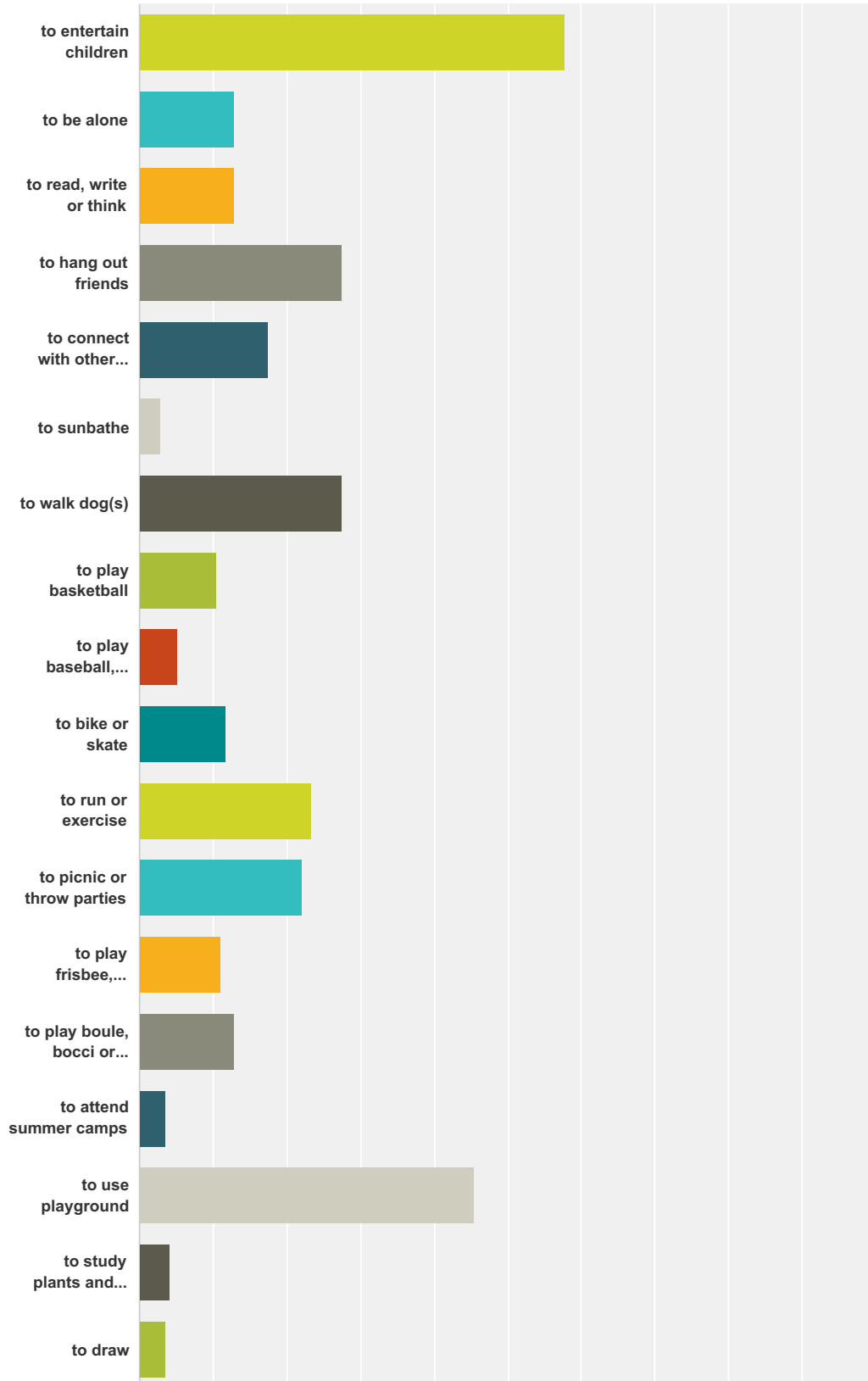

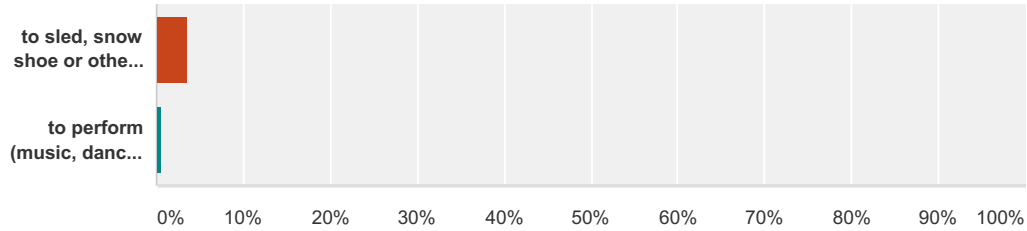

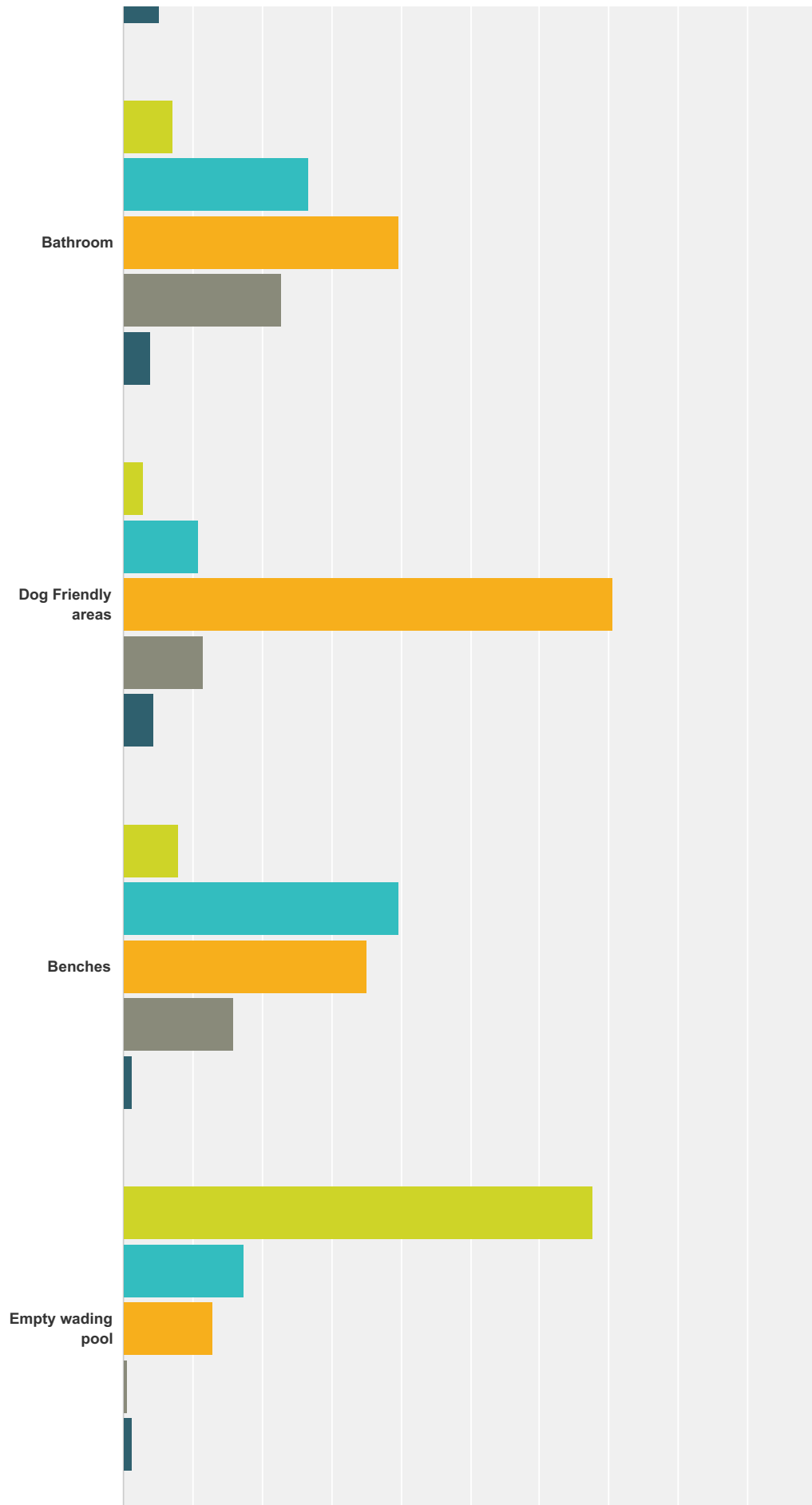

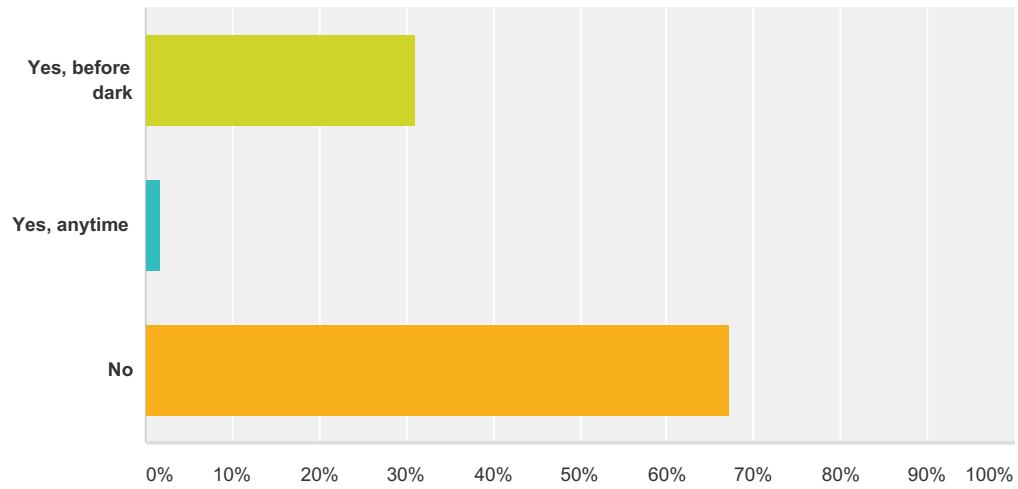

Q9 If you have children between the ages of 8-12, do you allow them to attend University Park without an adult?

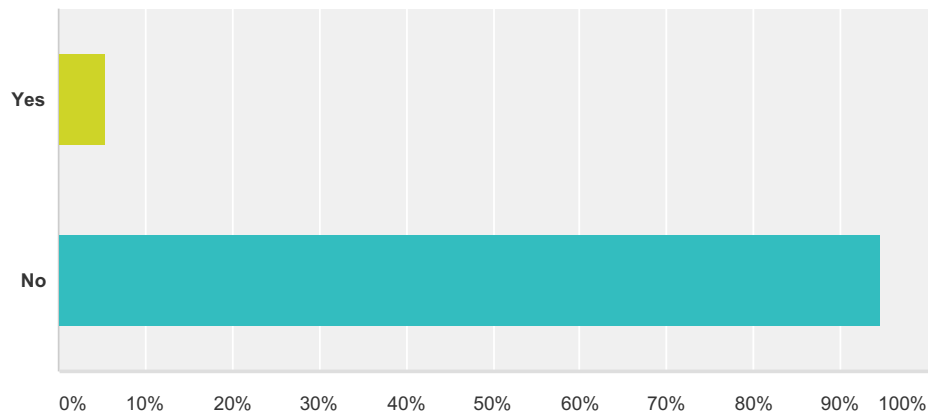

Q10 Have you ever been the victim of, or witness to, a crime at University Park?

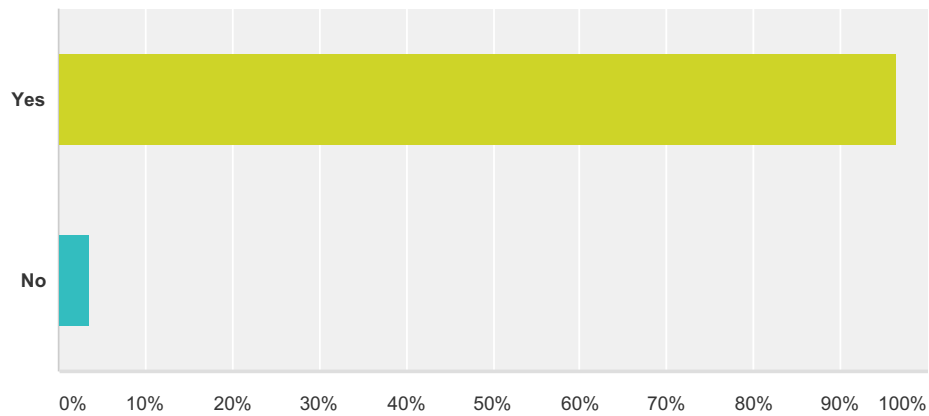
